27 SummerNationals & DEFINITELY - NOT out!

The weather "oop North" gave some concern in the days leading up to the Show, but, as usual I sold my soul... & apart from a few spots the weather overall was very well behaved, never too hot, just pleasant throughout for the 2 days of the blockbusting 27th UK SummerNational.

FRIDAY Most early birds listened to my plea "nobody in the village before 2pm", a few ignored or didn't read!! We really do have **so much preparation** on the Friday before opening so must continue to stress to **everyone** - please go for a coffee or a pint somewhere to avoid disturbing us before 2pm! Stallholders buffet in BBR's saleroom offered a sneak auction preview, overseen by Mark Nightingale. Thanks to everyone for a co-operative /stress free Friday operation. Later tea for BBR team in the Milton, good food, few pints of Skull Duggery... then down to the Market for Barnsley Gold and dishing out w/e tickets for the keenos.

SATURDAY In the main a fairly trouble free & swift stallholder move on, we even let the Early Entry queue in a minute early. A great first day. Truly magnificent Competitions & Displays. Main hall closed at 4pm, BBR saleroom remained open until 5pm, then prepare for the Saturday Social - presentations, big **FREE** buffet, cash prize quiz - £100 this year, so next years bonus rises to £300 for anyone getting **all** answers correct. Quite a late, but again trouble free, night.

SUNDAY Car Boot bright & breezy @ 9am, and the final day of trading, and viewing the Competitions & Displays with various awards placed by winners. The w/e concluded with the mega auction, all eyes on the 'star lots' littered throughout the smaller than usual selection. Here's a brief run down with add ons:

Pot lids: The Hill & Ledger started proceedings, keenly contested, secured by a UK collector £3,300 - world record price ever for this variant. The restored Matthews & Blight Bloater Paste £615, large Baildon & Son monument pictorial £590.

Ginger beers: Solid little grouping topped with the Lovatt & Lovatt crown cap sample.

Inks: Maybe the smallest ever gathering of such - just 4 pottery examples spearheaded with the Martin Bros tortoise £2,830, & the fabulous Lord Brougham £1,535.

Minerals: Highlight was always going to be the Southsea amber lip valve. Think the new owner was **never** going to go home without it - £2,360. The repaired black glass Winthrop's codd found a new home for £1,300, whilst the grouping of Connors variants each saw spirited bidding - lot 45 £885, lot 46 £770.

Pub jugs/ Whisky: The superlative world class Barnsley Brewery topped this sector @ £1,120, but the wonderful, totally different, Masons hand inscribed mallet, dated 1913 was not far behind at £885, and the grand John Walker clear glass whisky barrel £590. A strong category throughout - worth jotting down BBR's new auction date of Saturday 11th November for the Antique Advertising & Breweriana sale.

Medicines/ poisons etc: With Mike Tills incredible collection offering was always going to be one of the best ever selections of such at any previous BBR sales, nobody was disappointed. The 'dishy' Jas Barclay Daffy's Elixir was always going to be one of the week-ends 'stars', tensions were high, cameras and videos aready... as BBR recorded another world record for such @ £6,255. Next in performance terms - the large green Fishers £1,535, followed by the Yorkshire dug Indian Mixture Piles Cure £885. Again a strong field throughout. Poisons next - all performing about expected or slightly higher.

Stoneware: The unique Sheffield pub named Lord Brougham made a healthy, not unexpected, £770 & the fine quality Wainfleet slab seal (ex Dennis Northmore Collection) reached £555.

Advertising: The wonderful Wilkinson & Simpson Newcastle on Tyne Health Salt enamel sign totted up to £1,300, whilst the attractive, rare, Schweppes mirror barometer found a new home for £1,060, whilst the small size Fry's cabinet pediment was chased keenly to £650.

The finale: Some black glass began the exciting climax! Top slot was the magnum sealed onion won on the telephone for £4,720, the incredible (*to have survived*) Stella salad oil was £3,660 nail bitingly contested - I think shocked quite a few? Despite great efforts it slipped away from the UK! Then the incredible small size shaft & globe type £2,240, followed by the glorious Alloa style masonic symbols sealed wine £2,125.

Everything rounded off with the trio of skull poisons... videos going all over the place again. The large size reached £2,710, mid size £2,950, & the tiniest (*rarest by far*) £3,300... followed by applause for all the successful bidders and in appreciation of the entire hard working BBR crew!
