Minerals: Hamiltons remain the ‘buzz’ word as far as minerals are concerned: the late Dennis Northmores 2 salt glaze initial offerings - St Ives Gingerade @ £1,530 & the Bathgate/ Calcutta £1,240 beaten by the damaged (much conjectured over) cobalt lge size John Arkle £2,120. Late Len Blackmores labelled Edwards Patent £1,060. Best ‘rattley’ mineral - amber dumpy W Row/ Newcastle £1,120 & the wonderfully coloured Tindell/ Hull £800.

G.b’s: All white Fred Guthrie/ Hartlepool £1,000, blue transfer Silloth (slight base flake) £670, oval transferred Wm Row/ Newcastle £530.

Inks: More from a major collection (300+) gave some surprises - £1,180 topped all in the form of an amber (full of air bubbles) Derby All British, dark amber example (chipped) £380. Mid blue cottage (corner cracked) £355. A strong presentation - lots more in October!!

Miniatures: Albarose lid & base £1,530, Galley of Lorne whisky £780, Stiff & Sons g.b. £710, Fulham g.b. £650.

Kitchenalia: Great gathering here: milkmaid cow shop figure £1,500, Cream Pail £590. Best cream was the sml green top East Finchley £520, blue top & transfer ‘Abbott Bros/ East Ham £355. Just wait for the larger spread in October? Glasgow Evergreen Ammonia £425. Cornishware ‘Jamaica Pepper’ £710.

Whisky jugs: Some real ‘pearlers’ here - sml green top Auld Lang Syne £1,890, lge example £1,300. Burns Farewell to Mary £1,300, House of Commons Buchanan (sepia pict.) £730, Doulton artware whisky barrel £1,120. Doulton Lambeth ‘Duniva’ water jug £1,180.

Tins: This offering drew in a ‘new crowd’ - the Crawfords racing car shot to £2,480, Pearce Duff’s blue van £1,530, Jacobs Royal Mail van £1,180, Huntley & Palmer brown delivery van £1,000.

Advertising: John Haig’s cowboy enamel £1,770, Wellington Journal enamel £1,180. Stowers Lime Juice figure with plaque £710. Magnificent curve sided display cabinet (very thin) £730.

Pharmacy: Ice blue Daffy’s £1,180, lip damaged aqua Dr Websters £770.

Stoneware: Westerwald Queen Mary jug £2,360, 1839 dated flagon £1,890, sml Brighton pub named fish £1,240, lge pub named Lord Brougham reform £1,120, Bethnal Green impr’d hip flask £910, dated salt glaze whisky mallet £830, Lowestoft slab sealed porter £1,180.
