“Mega hot stuff!”

Each and every year the bottle world focus's upon the SummerNational week-end - to judge how the hobby is faring, will the auction hold up, will there be a good spread of stock/ good stallholder presence?

Each and every year we are not disappointed, as regular as clockwork it comes to fruition - and boy did it do so this year - with the added bonus of glooooooosoooooious sunshine throughout.

Any grumbles? Always....

Q: Why £10 week-end pass on Saturday if I want to come for just one day?

A: It is a 2 day event. There is a 1 day ticket for just Sunday.

Then, poor old Jack. His first ever BBR duty.... soon as the Market doors were opened the Early Entry mob came in.... dashed up to the barrier and he dared not say boo to a goose - as the inside stallholders were themselves just coming onto site!

Undisputably the most anticipated **ever** UK SummerNational auction which very effectively drew a hot, hot, hot week-end to a dramatic conclusion. Some remarkable results, with a trickling of bargains for the astute, and patient onlookers.

An initial glitch at the start (*aaaaargh - too many telephone and late bids!*) delayed us, but once kicked off saw a tired, but alert, AB rattled through the lots, with a more sedate pace for the 'stars' as they appeared.

Enough high fliers in every category to keep the various section afficianados

Pot lids: Possibly no great surprises here, greatest selection ever, collectors decided what each was worth - most going beyond the conservative estimates. The big bear with damage made its price, the smaller bear (much rarer) hotly contested, the brown print Reindeer Marrow @ £2,120 reflected its extreme rarity, the Miller's Pomade was considered by some to be a 'snip', but £2,830 is certainly respectable. Lids certainly seem to be strong/ holding their own?

Soft drinks: Another fabulous broad spread - the Schon's always there to make hearts flutter/ raise eyebrows - so £12,390 perhaps didn't shock the knowledgeable? Such an important offering, quite competitively chased (the postal bidders never got into the chase. An aqua UK mineral water patent world record I guess? The 6oz blue Emmerson recorded £6,140, the uncleaned amber Lockharts Acme Reliance £1,180. The Stockers stoneware hamilton some expected to go into the four figures, but £945 was fairly sound. The black glass hamilton sadly failed to reach its reserve.

Inks: The Blackwoods (lot 52) managed £570 - compared to the example recently dug (with original tin top) sold for £830. The rest found their own levels with some

Kitchenalia: Guess the early Doulton 'Pure Milk' pail did not have the visual 'oomph' to outperform the previous 2 this year, however, it did make a solid £2,950, the Ternhill cream (unique) £1,000 and the Kirkstall mustard jar £530 (a number have appeared the last few years). The blue & black John Gray marmalades made £260 and £140 respectively.

Alcoholic beverages: The stunning Blue Bonnet whisky was always going to be the leader here and my how it was chased, secured by a determined Stan 'the man' Wilson for £4,720 (another world record for a UK transferred whisky?) The Doulton artware Sunderland scored a round £1,180, pipped by the earlier Colonel Bogey water jug for £1,300, the fabulous Blackburn jug not far behind @ £1,000. All the coasters reflected their respective availability - best being the Trumans £450. £1,890 for the Greenlees figure, again, about right?

Advertising: Enamels were, as always, as well represented at this show as anywhere else in the UK and the assembled throng of afficianados reflected a continuing strength in this field: Burma Sauce ("... a beat" commented one onlooker) £1,300, Pickfords Removals (double sided, pristine) £1,180, striding policeman and nurse 'Wellington & Shrewsbury News' £945, the seated smoker version £770. The impressive (large house needed) Oswestry Removals poster £825, glass 'Starkey, Knight & Ford (Devon) £790.

Pharmacy: Deep breathes as Alan Austin chased the spectacular green (unique) Martin's patent to £9,440. The small submarine also surprised @ £1,535 - delightfully thin ends, and undamaged too. The three Daffy's attracted considerable bidders from all corners of the globe: lot 200, light aqua, embossed simply to front & rear, £2,005, 'classic' mid green £4,010, light olive green £885 - but then all surpassed by the marvellously whittled Reigate Caves Webster's for £4,720. Even the flint glass Spilsbury scored well at £2,005, then the seeming bargain (£770) black Dunn's. The blue Handysides Syrup shot to £790 - but when will you see another?

Stoneware: the small, early, London handled impressed '... Varnish Maker' flask screamed to £1,535, its nearest rival was the top reform - Crimean - £770 (despite basal glaze 'flaw' - or is that "enhancement"?)

Early glass & the finale..... most of the black glass found its worth, but nothing flew here. The Reigate pickles were chased by telephone, overseas in attendance, and private bidders (for others?) and despite AB's 'stabs' - well they settled wherever - best being the Royal Standard & the Cathedral straight after - each for £670. The glorious Pratt plaque proved the cherry atop the SummerNational cake - £4,370, making the entire sale the highest ever BBR total - a milestone in the UK Bottle hobby - showing the world that those there empties are indeed worth taking note of! Like Roger Pellow "... we know 'us onions - for sure!'"

Lot 8 the telephone money machine £140. A selection of Henry Horne inks found a firm following, best was lot 40 (2 wooden wells) £90 & a Staffs 'gents head' (lot 39) £67. A repaired Queen Victoria salt glaze reform was chased to £160, as were a pair of Bristol blue decanters (minus stoppers). The sepia boat pictorial teapot stand was much admired, & chased to £170. Lot 113 was the best postcard album performer @ £110. The delightful small, early, transferred mug (285) made £95.

The usual spread of bargains interspersed with a few 'fliers'. Saturday now very much an established feature of BBR's week-ends, much loved by keen & eager bargain hunters, & v**THE PLACE** to move large volumes, & any middle of the road items.
