## History was well & truly made, & captured on video!

Always slightly a tad nervous prior to a big Elsecar w/e, unsure why, continued huge/ attendance makes it all worthwhile.

**SATURDAY** The resplendant new BBR saleroom (down by red phone box) was ram jam packed with the ever faithful "merry crowd" (?), plus some new blood/ faces. They were all impressed with the friendly set up, & the 'Coddswallop Cafe' (bacon & sausage sarnies on arrival, pie & peas for lunch). All vowed to return, eagerly asking "when's the next one?"

**SUNDAY** Full marks to stallholders & early entrants - one of the smoothest ever set up/ EE sessions. A few always try it on. Whilst I attempt to comply with Health & Safety (BMBC ever eagle eyed, waiting to find fault/ pounce), avoid vehicle/ people chaos, plus ensure stallholders only get 30 mins to carry all stock inside & move car before Early Entry queue floods in (massive again). Classic scenario as stallholders wait outside (in glorious sunshine) for the big green Blg 21 doors to open.... visitor wanders up, I approach "excuse me are you a stallholder?" "No just looking for someone!" Behind is another "excuse me are you a stallholder?" "No", he says, "I'm with him!" This time one tried to sneak in with "after all these years you should let me in for free!" If only BMBC were so appreciative eh? I was in awe at the buzz & attendance from the moment the main doors opened - a true pleasure to behold. Live online bidding slow the sale down, but brings a small trickle of new collectors, hopefully at some point to join actual shows?

*Sale highlights - prices here with add ons:*

**Pot lids:** No spectacular high fliers this time but worth noting coloured lids fared encouragingly a tad better than of late. Best bear was the Henry Burton @ £365, just beaten by the green Sandringham girl pictorial £35. The delightful long haired Kranol pictorial tied with the 'classy' blue transferred Anchovy paste (coat of arms pictorial) both £for £285.

**Minerals:** Another blue codd - this time the spectacular, ultra rare, Winthrop Acme Reliance, magnificently restored a while back by Simon Bennett - £3,070 & a smae patent, equally rare, Finsbury amber with the magic Bennett restoaration touch £650. Ross's Devon & Somerset amber dumpy (professionally cleaned) £825. Redlipped Kelvedon with some surface dullness reached a steady £770 but was topped by the rare Connors Patent (ex Garth Morrison collection) competitively chased to £945.

**Miniatures:** Two lots stood out in this field, both eagerly chased: 2.5ins clear glass codd with rubber (?) stopper in neck £415 & a tiny 1ins tall 'Dartnell's g.b. £300.

**Creams:** Giant 8.25ins Escrick dairy reached £320, & the Blackmoor Vale Dairies/ Bournemouth cylinder did £260.

**Kitchenalia:** Amongst the mixed variety offered worth noting were the 2 highest ammonias (ex Ian McKenzie Collection) - Peebles Bros/ Dundee £530, Andrew Laird/ Glasgow £500. Then 2 fine filters were chased - the unusual Doulton dark green glazed example to £210, topped by the highly ornate & attractive white sprigged, on a cream body, Lipscombe £250. Look out for an even greater spread in both our December 4th auction, then again January 28/ 29!

**Whisky/ beer:** Great to see this area continuing to burgeon - helped with a ange of high rarities... they keep trickling out! A trio of the Galley of Lorne range, 3 shape/ size variations, was something to behold - the extra large size £830, the scarce footed variant £650, & the standard (transferred 'Galley of Lorne' at the bottom £240. Amongst the water jugs the Colonel Bogey edged to £670 reflecting bargain times in this area still, whilst a spectacular (but damaged) blue glass Haigs reached £410, & a wonderful blue topped Doulton 'Dart Brand' £320. A restored Bulldog .

**Medicines/ poisons etc:** All eyes fell upon the main act - the stunning Dr Sibley's, with AB's usual "come & buy me" estimate (watch the video: <https://youtu.be/hl2XBHp5SgY>). Three main contenders battled it out, very dramatically in the room. Everyone was quite, you could feel the tension, hesitant, late bids.... culminating in a successful Mick Wylie @ £9,680. Next thre trio of Prices: double capacity £455, labelled Prices Soap £530, labelled & sealed full £240. Samuel Reeves poison patent (offset neck) £530. Sealed Fergusons Arsenate of Lead jar £260.

**Early glass & stoneware:** No great shakers this time: country brown blazed potty £155, salt glaze Charles Dickens bust £140. In the black glass range: the shiniest mallet £240, one with some dullness (but crudely tilting) £210), & one overall dull/ patinated, lots of character, £155.
