## An all round party atmosphere...

Sunday Stall holders keep coming from near & far (regularly from Europe & overseas), the early entry queue, & later visitors, all wholly impressive, testament to the importance of Elsecar as our ongoing hobby flagship? Winter time is always a bit of a gamble - this year the weather seemed to take a "slight rest" to allow BBR's WinterNational to be trouble free of such, though even when it falls "oop North" it generally avoids Elsecar (in the valley) but we can see white on the hills to the West.

The Scots 'crew' ensured we were prepared for the Sunday morning rush, & this time I had to turn away just one early arrival enabling our efficient setting up regime to run like clockwork! Early entry & visitors entering just by the Market entrance makes our control so much easier - especially for H & S! Expected good performers in most fields, from an enthusiastic floor crowd who can be seen from the rostrum to 'change over' as each specialist section unfolds. The internet slows proceedings slightly but we continue to hone, more finely, the Sunday spread to avoid a too lengthy sale.

Pot lids: Multicoloured Prattware appears still in the doldrums - unless it is an especial rarity, or clear variant to the norm', whilst regional b & w scarcities continue to draw enthusiastic followers, understandably so given the few numbers such have been found in. Thus, the coloured background Royal Alexandra reached £650 & the square St Annes regional 'gem' fetched £590, & one of the UK's all time 'classic' pictorial lids - the Wrinehill Ointment saw a rock solid £530 the latter two in the room.

Soft & hard drinks: No great high flying gingers this time round, the market is defo' 'hungry' for such. Meanwhile 'classy rattlers' of the glass type drew healthy competition, the fabulous cellar found De Gruchy hamilton a worthy £3,190 hammer, & the exceedingly rare A1 6oz size green lip Oldham owl pictorial a whacking £1,420.

Inks: Rare inks have a worldwide following, but the light blue Chandler cottage @ £3,070 & the much rarer mid blue Temple barrel @ £355 both remained in

The 'hard stuff': Top water jugs have made quite a visible strong 'come back' - so, Barnsley Brewery multicoloured Doulton example £1,060, same for the Buchanans Red Seal (hunt pict.), £820 Buchanan 'Good Spirits' £970, W Williams 'Forty Second' £945, £755 for a well printed House of Commons.

Advertising: A good 'spread' of rock solid performers, no ultra highs. The much anticipated etched 'Codd Patent' mirror sadly failed to meet hoped for lofty heights as it was felt not of the period the date suggested, by several decades, so just £295.

Pharmacy: Mike Tills high quality collection items are nearing an end this sale topped with an impressive ribbed green enamelled shop round for £970.

Early stuff: A good mix of salt glaze but again nothing truly eye opening or jaw dropping. By far the best here was the late 'ish, but superb condition, shaft & globe £1,300.

Everything stopped at lot 85 for all to sing happy birthday to Gordon Litherland, & pass over a pictorial cake!


